


if you go to fakerarewallet.com and get signed in on your xcp phrase.... from there you can view the marketplace (currently available or bids on cards for XCP or pepecash)




from there you can look at the big board.



- * Put through an CARD/XCP order of low value.
- * use the shittiest most peasnt TX known to humanity use RPW and click custom fee... crank it down a ways.
- * now you have an orde in the mempool that everyone can see....
- * it will take ages to finalise the TX
- * meanwhile you card that has been put up for cheap and advertised byt yourself to everyone garners interest, but scoppoors.
- * they can place a bid using a normal TX fee that will come through quickly to put an order in that matches or goes above the price.
- * when your TX (the for sale card with the cheap TX) confirms it will go to the person who has bid the highest on the book.
